Arnold's Promise Witch Hazel	6m	6m	One of the better yellow flowering cultivars. Large blooms are fragrant and long lasting starting in late winter.	5
Autumn Brilliant Apple Serviceberry Clump	5m	7.5m	White flowers in spring, orange fall colour.	4
Camperdown Elm	7m	8.5m	Weeping form with blocky bark. Looks scaly.	4
Canadale Euonymus STD	1.5m	1.25m	Large bright gold & green evergreen leaves.	5
Canadian Serviceberry Clump	6m	3m	Full of white flowers in spring, orange fall colour, edible berries.	4
Cole's Select Serviceberry Clump	6m	5m	Exceptional orange red fall colour.	4
Corkscrew Hazel STD	2.5m	2.5m	Gnarled, twisted stems are interesting in winter.	4
Cornelian Cherry	7m	6m	Yellow flowers in March, exfoliating bark, red fruit is edible.	4
Cranberry Cotoneaster STD	1m	1.25m	Graceful spreader that produces large red fruit. Bronzy-red fall colour.	4
Double Flowering Almond STD	2m	2.5m	Double bright pink blooms cover the limbs in May.	2
Dwarf Burning Bush STD	1.2m	1.2m	Best used for its striking fall colour.	3
Dwarf Eastern Catalpa STD	7m	8m	Dwarf, bushy form grafted onto a standard.	5
Emerald & Gold STD	1.2m	90cm	Green & gold evergreen leaves.	5
Emerald Gaiety STD	1.5m	1.5m	Green & white evergreen leaves.	5
European Snowball STD	3.5m	3.5m	Extremely showy white ball shaped flowers, scarlet fall colour.	3
Flame Maple STD	7m	7m	Brilliant orange red fall colour.	2
Fragrant Snowball STD	2.5m	2m	Large fragrant pink/white flowers in late spring.	5
Globe Maple	4m	5m	Attractive ball shaped head, yellow fall colour.	4
Hakuro Nashiki Dappled Willow STD	2.5m	2m	Variegated foliage opens with glossy bright pink, turning to a pink/white.	3
Rose of Sharon STD's	3m	3.5m	Come in many different colours.	
Japanese Angelica Tree	4.5m	3.5m	Large clusters of white flowers in August. Does well in dry soil.	5
Lilac STD's	3m	2.5m	Come in many different colours.	
Kwanzan Japanese Cherry	7m	5m	Double pink spring flowers. Good specimen tree.	5
Kyushu Hydrangea STD	2.5m	2.5m	Brilliant white spike flowers in summer.	3
Newport Flowering Plum	5m	4m	Dark purple foliage all season. Pink spring blooms.	4
P.G. Hydrangea STD	2m	2.5m	Huge white cone shaped flowers in summer.	4
Pagoda Dogwood	7m	10m	4 seasons of interest! White spring flowers, blue berries, red fall colour, horizontal branching.	3
Paperbark Maple	7m	5m	Beautiful cinnamon exfoliating bark, stunning red fall colour.	5
Pink Diamond Hydrangea STD	2.5m	2.5m	Flowers opening white, turning pink with cooler weather.	3
Purple Fountain Beech	6m	4m	Narrow, weeping purple beech. Great specimen plant.	6

Purpleleaf Sandcherry STD	3.5m	2.5m	Pink flowers in May, maroon foliage all season.	3
Red Jade Weeping Crabapple	5m	5m	Profusion of white flowers, bright red shiny fruit.	3
Rohan Obelisk Beech	4m	1m	Compact, pyramidal form with dark purple dissected leaves.	4
Rohan Purple Beech	4m	1m	A vigorous grower with glossy leaves.	4
Royal Beauty Weeping Crabapple	4.5m	2m	Weeping form with reddish foliage and red flowers.	3
Royalty Crabapple	5m	5m	Purplish leaves and red flowers.	4
Russian Olive	6m	5m	Silvery foliage, yellow sweet scented flowers in June. Tolerant of city conditions.	2
Sarcoxie Euonymus STD	1.2m	1.2m	Dark green evergreen leaves. Orange berries.	5
Saskatoon Serviceberry	3m	2m	Native plant, wildlife loves the berries. Extremely cold hardy.	1
Seven-son Flower	6m	3m	A rare specimen plant. White flowers turn green to rose to purple, long lasting. Drought tolerant. Exfoliating bark.	5
Shubert Chockcherry	5.5m	5m	New growth comes in green, quickly turns purple. White fragrant flowers.	2
Sir Lancelot Crabapple	2.5m	2m	Very compact growth. Pink buds, white flowers. Orange fruit.	4
Snow Fountain Cherry	4m	5m	Weeping form, covered in white blooms in spring.	5
Sun Valley Maple	6m	6m	Cross between Red Sunset & Autumn Flame. Red fall colour.	4
Thunderchild Crabapple	5m	5m	Single pink flowers, very resistant to fire blight.	3
Twisted Young's Weeping Birch	5m	5m	Twisted, weeping form.	2
Twisty Baby Robinia	5m	6m	White cascading flower chains, irregular spreader with twisted branches.	4
Umbrella Tree	3m	2.5m	Dwarf habit, very ornamental with large glossy leaves.	5
Velvet Pillar Crabapple	6m	5m	Single pink blooms, maroon foliage, upright growth habit.	4
Walker's Weeping Caragana	1.8m	1.8m	Finely cut leaves, yellow flowers.	2
Weeping Caragana	1.8m	1.8m	Yellow flowers, nice specimen for beds or by entrances.	2
Weeping Corkscrew Hazel	3m	4m	Distinct weeping, very twisted branches.	4
Weeping Higan Cherry	7m	8m	Weeping form, covered in pink blooms in spring.	5
Weeping Lavender Twist Eastern Redbud	2.5m	3m	Very early pink blooms. Umbrella shaped crown with twisted branches.	4
Weeping Mulberry	4m	5m	Vigorous dense growth, looks like an umbrella.	3
Weeping Pussy Willow	1.5m	1.5m	Weeping form that has fuzzy buds.	4
White Flowering Dogwood	7m	8m	Limey flowers in May-June, horizontal branches.	5
White Tigress Maple	6m	9m	Interesting white stripes on bark.	5
Wine & Roses Weigela STD	1.5m	1.5m	Burgundy leaves, hot pink flowers in summer.	4
Witch Hazel	5m	5m	Small yellow flowers in fall, yellow fall colour.	5
Young's Weeping Birch	5m	5m	Dwarf birch with slender pendulous branches.	2
Gray Dogwood STD	3m	2.5m	Vigorous dense native shrub, good for sun to shade. Gray bark.	4
Royal Purple Smoke Tree	2.5m	2.5m	Purple leaves and smoke-like flowers.	5
Weeping Golden Chain Tree	6m	4.5m	Long drooping yellow flowers.	5
Magnolias			Many different colours, varying sizes.	
Korean Sun Ornamental Pear	6m	6m	White flowers in spring, intense red fall colour, pea sized fruit.	4

Black Willow	3-10m	5m	Long pointed leaves, flowers April – June.	4
Fernleaf Fullmoon Maple	3m	3m	Low branched small tree with deeply cut leaves.	5
Alder Tree	5m	5m	Good for moist areas. Distinct lenticels.	3
Purple Hazel	6m	6m	Dark purple leaves fade to dark green in summer.	4
Red Cascade European Spindle	7m	6m	Scarlet fall colour, rosy red capsules with orange seeds.	4
Vernal Witch Hazel	2.5m	2m	Ribbon like fragrant flowers in Feb/March.	4
Diane Witch Hazel	2.5m	2m	Orange flowers late winter. Fall colour.	4
Common Chockcherry	7m	6m	White flowers, edible fruit, use for conservation & wildlife.	3
Native Pussy Willow	6m	1.5m	Catkins appearing before leaves in early spring, tolerates wet conditions.	4
Giant Pussy Willow	4m	1.5m	Catkins the size of a rabbit's foot! Best in moist conditions.	4
Cracked Willow	25m	1.5m	Catkins before leaves, prefers wet conditions.	5
Nannyberry	6m	2m	Flattish white flower clusters followed by fruit that birds love. Sun to Shade.	2
